



FLEETCROSS NAVIGATION

FleetCross only requires two essential navigation functions. These are both activated by left and right clicking a hand driven “mouse”.

MOUSE

A computer mouse is a remote switch which activates certain computer functions without the necessity of touching the key board. The position of the mouse is seen on the computer screen as an arrow, also called the cursor. As your hand moves the mouse, the cursor will move with it. In the FleetCross Training Modules, the required cursor locations are explained.

LEFT CLICK

The left key of a mouse activates a command to the computer to take the next step in the navigation process.

- a. One left click results in the next step being activated when the cursor is on top of an activation point on the computer screen.
- b. A double left click opens or closes a new function separate from the main navigation. For example, it opens an illustration from the TurboDoc index and it closes a pop-up screen which provides an expanded space for an explanation.
- c. Hold left and swipe across is used in Adobe Acrobat illustrations to highlight a part number for transport into FleetCross TurboSearch+ via another right then left click.

RIGHT CLICK

The right key of a mouse activates a small pop-up screen which contains further navigation options, such as launching a cross-reference search or posting a part number. The right click is used when the cursor is on top of an activation point on the computer screen, such as a cross reference part number in TurboSearch+. Once the pop-up screen is activated, a left click is used to select the navigation function shown in the pop-up.
